### PE kits



At Barlby we know the importance of keeping active and ensuring the children are taught their entitlement of 2 hours of PE every week.

This includes one 'Indoor PE' session which is either dance, gymnastics, yoga or fitness games and an 'Outdoor PE' session which covers football, hockey, athletics and other team games.

As part of the PE lesson, the children should be changing into a clean PE kit every lesson.

This should include the following:

- A blue t-shirt (this can have have the Barlby logo but this is not compulsory)
- Black or navy blue shorts, leggings or tracksuit bottoms
- Trainers or plimsolls

We encourage parents/carers to send their child in with a PE kit on a Monday and take it home on a Friday. Although the children have set PE days, this can change last minute dues to school logistics.


We also enjoyed the open mornings for Learning Zone 1 and 2 this week, where the children shared their fabulous learning!











































































## Monty Moments!












































## The Wider Curriculum Autumn 2






























#### A snapshot of Year 1 so far...



What a fantastic start to Year 1 this has been! We have reunited with our friends, transitioned into the Year 1 timetable and have completed learning across the National Curriculum. Year 1 have enjoyed using our learning books to complete tasks and some of or learning will also be available to see on Tapestry too.

Our topic for this half term has been 'All About Me'. We have learnt about the human body, the five senses and looked at the features of different animals. With our findings, we were able to create pictograms and charts with tallies. Our book in English also relates to our 'All About Me' topic as it follows the story of a young girl who lives in a busy city, just like us! She is able to freeze time and help everyone around the city without them knowing. We understood the message behind the story as 'kindness is important even when someone doesn't realise'. From reading this book, we have produced amazing outcomes ranging from empathising with characters, using punctuation, using adjectives and extending our sentences using joining conjunctions like 'and' and 'because'. As we have been recapping our Phonics learning from last year, we have been able to use this to help us with our writing outcomes.


In Maths, we have been focusing on number formation and now we are able to write addition number sentences! We have also focused on number bonds within and to ten and have written them systematically!

We have also enjoyed the foundation subjects in Year 1 like Music, PSHE, RE, PE, Computing and Spanish too!
































### English at Barlby



For early reading, we are continuing the use of our Little Wandle Phonics Scheme and the associated 'Big Cat Phonics' books for Guided Reading. All year groups complete five lessons of Guided Reading a week in order to develop decoding, prosody, fluency and comprehension. Our library at Barlby is continuously growing and we have been accepted to be the recipients of even more new, inclusive, fun books! These books will be given to us by the Children's Book Project and will be available at school as well as to take home and keep!

After the half term, we have decided to introduce 'Reading Buddies' meaning that the children will have an opportunity to read with another child who is not in their class or cohort! This will be a designated time every week to encourage reading for pleasure. This allows even more time for children to read at school throughout the week. Further to this, a KS2 book club will also be starting after the half term at lunch time. This will continue the encouragement of the 'reading for pleasure' culture we have at Barlby as well as preparing your children for life at secondary school. We are also lucky enough to have such wonderful parents who have offered to come in during the school day and read with children. This is a great opportunity for the children to share a book with a new adult.

At Barlby, we also want to expand our love for writing. We have spoken with the children about their learning in English and discussed what they enjoy and what they would like to do more of. The books that we are reading in each year group are inclusive, engaging and related to the current Topic. This helps with broadening discussions and the development of our writing skills across the curriculum. We have made sure that children are exposed to a range of genres including both fiction and non-fiction texts. This will enable children to experience different use of language in order to change their style of writing to suit a task.

Lastly, we would like to say a huge thank you for those who were able to attend the Early Reading sessions held for parents and carers.
