

# A snapshot of Year 4...



What an amazing term Year 4 have had since September. They have settled into their new classes well, worked incredibly hard and made fantastic progress.

This term we have been learning how to "Save the Planet" with our eco-friendly topic. Within this topic, we learnt all about the different mountains of our planet, how they are formed, their features and where to find them using an atlas. We also looked at the trade of bananas and the different forms of renewable or non-renewable energy production. It really made us think about the ways in which we can all do our little bit to work towards a more eco-friendly planet!

Our English book was "The Rhythm of the Rain" a story all about Isaac who follows his jar of water as it travels through the water cycle. We have looked at how this cycle works and set up an experiment to see it in action. We then visited the London Wetland centre to learn more about this and how we can encourage water permeability to help the cycle continue.

In Guided Reading we enjoyed, "This Morning I met a Whale" a story based on the real-life events of a whale becoming stranded in the Thames. We learnt about some of the local birdlife and how to recognise them from their descriptions in the text. We researched whales and why a river like the Thames is so dangerous to them. Also, we looked at how we as humans are damaging our planet through deforestation, pollution and our rapidly growing population.

Since September we have covered a range of Mathematics topics such as, place value and the four operations. From this we consolidated our learning in using the column method for addition and subtraction. We have also started multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100 and using this skill to convert measurements of centimetres, millimetres or metres into another unit of measurement. We especially enjoy Fridays because we focus on problem solving and reasoning!

In our Computing lessons have built upon our previous learning and refreshed our coding knowledge, looking at the difference between a sprite and a costume and then using these to create animations. We then coded our now animated sprites to move around a screen and started creating a "Pacman" style game where other sprites would disappear when they come into contact with ours. Finally we started a new topic all around voice recording and audio editing through telling our best jokes.

Our RE focus this term was on Islam, and part of this was our exciting visit to the local Mosque where we held copies of the Quran and met the Imam who answered our questions. We looked at the 5 pillars of Islam and some children were excited to share their own experiences of fasting or Haji.

Our final trip was to Kensington Palace where we had been invited back to see the finished roundel designs that they had designed last year. During this trip we also met Queen Victoria who taught us all about the different traditions that the Victorians brought to the UK like Christmas trees, cards and even marching turkeys!

What a busy 8 weeks it has been!


























#### PSHE at Barlby




PSHE stands for Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education. As a subject, PSHE aims to provide children with the knowledge and skills to keep themselves happy, healthy and safe, as well as to prepare them for life and work.


PSHE at Barlby aims to give children the knowledge, skills, and attitudes that they need to effectively navigate the complexities of life in the 21st Century. The curriculum covers key areas which will support children to make informed choices now and in the future around their health, safety, wellbeing, relationships, and financial matters and will support them in becoming confident individuals and active members of society.

A range of teaching and learning activities are used and are based on good practice in teaching PSHE to ensure that all children can access learning and make progress.


At Barlby we teach PSHE weekly through a variety of ways. There are weekly assemblies on Tuesdays based on the Barlby values (respect, determination and creativity) supported by 'a question of the week'. The whole school enjoy presenting what they have discussed in class on Thursday's assembly. Outcomes vary from written work, circle times and group work.


There are meaningful opportunities for cross-curricular learning, in particular with Computing for online safety and Science for growing, nutrition, teeth, diet and lifestyle. PSHE at Barlby provides consistent messages throughout the age ranges including how and where to access help.











## Art and Design at Barlby



At Barlby, Art & Design is taught throughout the school from Nursery to Year 6. In Foundation Stage, it is covered in the 'Expressive Arts & Design' area of the EYFS Curriculum.

Here is a summary of learning in Key Stage 1 & 2 for the Autumn Term:

**Year 1**: As part of their 'All About Me' topic, the children explored the work of Joan Miró and used symbols, a limited palette and linear design to create a final work of art.

**Year 2**: As part of their 'Towers, Tunnels & Turrets' topic, the children explored artist Stephen Wiltshire and the architect of Trellick Tower, Ernő Goldfinger. They compared different skyscrapers, did observational sketches in front of Trellick and then created modern Trellick Tower art back in class.

**Year 3**: As part of their 'Hola Amigo!' topic, the children explored the architecture of Antoni Gaudi. They created their own salamanders using clay and decorated them with bright beads to replicate Gaudi's style.

**Year 4:** As part of their "Ancient Greece' topic, the children compared ancient Egyptian vase designs with the modern art of Keith Haring. They created their own plant pot designs.

Currently, Year 4 are working on their "Save The Planet" topic. The children are studying Banksy and other street artists. They are exploring the deeper meaning of certain artworks and will be using stencils to create their street art using symbolism.

**Year 5:** As part of their "Off With Their Head" topic, the children designed card and clay Tudor roses.

**Year 6**: As part of their "Victorians" topic, the children studied Victorian art and the work of L.S. Lowry with a focus on proportion and perspective.

Year 6's current topic is "Blood Heart" and they are exploring the art and life of Frida Kahlo, culminating in the children producing a mixed-media, sustained work of art.
