Bookings are live for the second half of the spring term - you are able to book and reserve your space for as many sessions as you please. Note that sessions are payable at the time of booking, therefore please only book what you are able to make payment for.

All services have limited spaces available and are payable upfront by parents via our website, and you can book up to 3 hours before the club taking place should there be a space available on the club that day.

Please note that from a safeguarding perspective, we are not covered to accept children who have not been booked onto a session. Therefore, please book your child/ren on online, in advance. If your child arrives at a session when no one else is on school site, we will accept them - however, you will be charged an additional £5 admin fee for our office team to invoice you. If the school reception is still open and your child is not on the register, we will ask them to call you to collect.

All ClubsComplete staff members are DBS checked, qualified and experienced working with children and have undertaken safeguarding children training.

Highlights:

- New Music Studio Debut: We kicked off the year with music lessons in our brand-new studio, providing students with an enhanced learning environment and a special space to make musical memories.

- **Rhythmic Immersion:** Year 6 students immersed themselves in rhythmic exploration, delving into music with a captivating calypso feel and learning more about the musical roots of the Notting Hill Carnival.
- **Samba Workshop:** Years 5 and 6 experienced the vibrant rhythms of Brazil through an exhilarating Samba Workshop enrichment day, led by the talented Inspire Works musicians.



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Year 6 at Barlby



Year 6 have had an exciting term full of learning. We returned from the winter break ready and focused on the term ahead. Our new topic is 'Frozen Kingdom' which has a Geography and Science focus. The children are learning about Antarctica and the importance of protecting our environment. We have looked closely at the geographical aspect of 'The Frozen Kingdom' in our Geography lessons by using maps, atlases, globes and digital/computer mapping to locate countries and describe the features.

We have also explored Antarctica by identifying its physical features and environmental concerns around this area. We identified that the world has different time and climate zones and by using map work, we have used different kinds of maps, for example: climate maps and physical maps.

Our class text for English has also linked to our topic which is Shackleton's Journey where the illustrator William Grill weaves a detailed visual narrative of Shackleton's journey to Antarctica. His beautiful use of coloured pencils and vibrant descriptions effortlessly suggests the adventure and excitement that surrounded the expedition. His rich with detail drawings have allowed the children to examine the diagrams of the provisions and the individual drawings of each sled dog and packhorse. We have taken on different roles as expedition members and researched about them to find out their roles on the expedition. We have done this through the use of spoken language to develop understanding through imagining and exploring ideas in discussion, role-play and drama. This also linked well within our Geography lessons as we mapped out Shackleton's journey on the map by marking significant locations within the story.

As part of our topic learning, we have also been to The Imax at The Science Museum to see a 3D showing of 'Antarctica'. It was a fantastic experience and the children learnt a lot from it. It showed how animal life has adapted to suit the extreme conditions.

Our Art was also linked to our topic and Mr Bird came into Year 6 to teach the children about Zaria Forman, an artist who documents climate change through pastels drawings. She travels to remote regions of the world to collect images and inspiration for her work, which is exhibited worldwide.

The children sketched some closely-observed preliminary drawings, before moving on to experiment with a very limited palette, whilst using a wide range of media. The children used oil and chalk pastels to create amazing art on glaciers.

Before the Winter break, we had a visitor from The National Theatre come in to facilitate an acting workshop based around the story of 'The Witches'. This was before we visited went to see a matinee performance of 'The Witches' at The National Theatre in mid-January. The show was incredible and the children absolutely loved it!
