### Attendance and Punctuality



We are working hard to improve our whole school attendance at Barlby. Regular attendance at school promotes pupils' well-being, maximises progress in learning and helps pupils reach their potential both now and in their future lives.

You can help us achieve our target by ensuring your children are in school, on time, every day. Pupils attendance and punctuality is monitored carefully by the school and our Education Welfare Officer. Everyday counts but every minute is equally important.

It is very important your child arrives on time for school. The school gates open at 8.20am. Anyone arriving after 8:40am will be considered late and must come through the main entrance. *Did you know? Being 15 minutes late each day over the school year is the same as missing 2 weeks of school.* 

If your child's attendance reaches below 90% we will send you a letter to inform you and hope to work with you to help improve their attendance. We have attendance incentives every term for children who achieve attendance of 98% or more. If you have any questions about attendance or feel you need some support, please do not hesitate to contact your class teacher or the school office.

Well done to Dalgarno 4, Bruce 1 and Orchard 2 and 3 for reaching or exceeding our school target of 95%.

## Online Safety Information for Parents



E-Safety and the constantly changing social landscape means it is increasingly difficult to keep on top of changes in apps and behaviours online. Here are some tips and key information about social media that you can use and apply to your children at home

#### **Parental control**

Do you have parental control or a firewall that protects children when they search online? This will mean you know the sites and apps that they will and won't be able to access.

#### Social media

Almost every social media app is designed for children ages 13+ meaning your child should not have access to it yet.


#### **Online Gaming**

Does your child play games online? Most games come with an age certificate for example Fortnite is rated 12+. When they are playing, are they speaking online and if so do you know who? Many games now have online features that connect players from all over the world. Check your child's games to see if they have that capability.

All of these measures will help to keep your child safer online.

Parents/carers are reminded that primary aged children should not be accessing the above social media platforms and it is essential that parental controls are activated on their devices.





Our Wider Curriculum at Barlby - new and improved!



At Barlby we believe that the offer we provide to our children through our curriculum is vital to their development in many ways both socially and academically.

As a whole school team we are working closely to refresh and recreate our Wider Curriculum to ensure it is engaging and reflective of not only our community, but the world we live in today.

Currently we deliver a topic based curriculum where we cover topics such as 'Ancient Egyptians' and 'Stargazers'. Moving forward we will be designing a new and exciting multi perspective curriculum that is diverse in its content, covering elements of the 9 protected characteristics and ensuring black history is embedded within the topics from Nursery to year 6.


Our topics will be posed as questions such as: 'Does history repeat itself?' 'Where are the 8 pyramids in the world?' An enquiry led topic will allow teachers and children to explore the topics in depth and create some wonderful and creative learning from them.

We will be prioritising our staff training sessions for the remainder of the year to focus on our curriculum. Watch this space!

## A snapshot of Nursery



Nursery's focus this term is Fairy tales. The children have been involved in many engaging and fun activities, all of which target at least one of the seven of the Early Learning Goals:



We have had an amazing start to Spring 2 in Nursery. Please see a summary of the range of learning and activities we have been doing since we returned from half term.

**Literacy**: We read a new fairy tale each week which generates lots of fascinating discussion about the characters and their motives. The children's favourite activity is when they role play each fairy tale of the week; this has really helped them to sequence stories.

**Phonics**: The children follow '*Little Wandle's Letters and Sounds scheme'*. They learn a sound a week and are now blending short words. They also learn to sing a nursery rhyme each week, which includes exploring rhyme and alliteration.

These are the sounds we have learned so far: s a t p i n m d g o c k e

**Mathematics**: We do lots of fun counting in Nursery and have learned to count up to and over 10. The children also know how to match amounts to a numeral. They are now starting to compare different amounts and use 2D shapes to make patterns. The children also love when we learn about number through dance.

**P.E.**: The children have two P.E. lessons every week where they learn to coordinate their bodies, follow instructions, learn rules and improve their gross motor skills.


#### The Other Early Learning Goals:

The majority of the children's learning in Nursery is done though small group work which is sometimes teacher-led and sometimes independent. You will see from the photographs below that we aim for all of our activities to be highly engaging and full of fun.

Here are just a few of the activities and things children have made so far this term: troll soup; cakes for Little Red Riding Hood's Granny; cardboard billy goats, bridges, Hansel and Gretel houses, wigs for Goldilocks and many more!

## Monty Moments!



#### Inviting Parents/Carers to read to classes:



































































## Barlby's code of Conduct
